



"Thor: The Dark World Review"



Marvel has once again reminded the entire movie industry that they are not to be forgotten. The original <u>Thor</u> was a decent movie in its own right, but it was neither remarkable or one of the stronger Marvel films. It paled in comparison to the <u>Iron</u> <u>Man</u> trilogy and the <u>Avengers</u>, and it made the comic book fans a bit hesitant about a sequel. <u>Thor: the Dark World</u>, though, redeemed the Thor movies and added depth to the movie adaption of the superhero himself.

The exposition of the film captured the entire cinema's attention, and the movie was perfectly paced; there were emotional scenes and background information tied in with the action and adventure one would normally attribute to superhero movies about godly blonds with magical hammers. <u>Dark World</u>'s plot was an intriguing blend of traditional Norse mythology and pieces of comic book stories patched together, and the complexity of it definitely paid off. The Night Elves were unique concepts with beautiful character designs (with "beautiful" being synonymous for "uniquely unsettling and a bit scary").

I have always had a soft spot for the architecture and world-building involved in a movie production, especially one that mainly takes place in a fictitious place with no practical constraints of the modern day and its rows of steel buildings. Asgard - and the different worlds Thor visits – was completely breathtaking, and I could have spent hours watching footage of nothing but the buildings and geography of this world.

The actors in Dark World gave an awe-inspiring performance. Chris Hemsworth once more captured the essence of Thor, all mighty rage and too much heart, and Tom Hiddleston has always been one of my personal favorites, but he really blew me away in this film. I fell in love with his acting all over again; while he was snarky and blank-faced, his eyes clearly portrayed the pain that Loki was feeling. Malekith, the main villain, was played by Christopher Eccleston and – even though it was hard to tell it was actually him beneath all of the make-up – he did an amazing job. The most notable thing about the acting, though, was that everyone in the film gave near-flawless performances, and that included the supporting actors' talent, an unusual thing in most films, where all of the production money is spent on the main characters, leaving the casting crew to hire mediocre actors.

One of the biggest problems I had with <u>Thor</u> was the forced love interest in the form of Jane Foster. She was an underdeveloped character that only added unneeded interruptions in what plot it had. In <u>Dark World</u>, she is still a *bit* irritating, but the love feels much more real; it was written with care this time, and it gave Jane her own unique characterization in turn.

The Warriors Three and Lady Sif returned once more, and I was absolutely thrilled at how included they were in the story line; they have always been my personal favorites. Frigga earned the respect of the entire movie audience with her courageous sacrifice, and it was a definite pro-feminism film in that Frigga acted independently of Odin while the All-Father himself did absolutely nothing consequential. Loki really earned his "silvertongued" title in this film, his dialogue a perfect blend of biting remarks and sarcastic quips that occasionally drew out into rambles merely to irritate those that were forced to listen.

All in all, <u>Thor: The Dark World</u> was an outstanding film. I was very emotionally invested in the story line (to the point that there were tears during several occasions, much to my mother's amusement), and the CGI was break-taking. The actors gave riveting performances and the mid-credits scene was the perfect prelude to the Guardians of the Galaxy movie.

"Typhoon Haiyan Strikes the

Earlier this month a typhoon hit the Philippines, killing more than a 10,000 people and leaving more than 600,000 people displaced; more than 9.5 million were affected. Roads, bridges and airports were destroyed or covered in all of the wreckage. Not one building escaped damage. The city and nearby villages were flooded, leaving floating bodies and roads covered with debris from fallen trees, tangled power lines and flattened homes. Ninety U.S. Marines and Sailors headed to the Philippines in a first wave of promised military assistance for relief efforts. U.S. aid groups also launched a multi-million dollar relief campaign. President Benigno Aquino of the Philippines said the government had deployed 300 soldiers and police to restore order in Tacloban, which is a city in the Philippines. We can only hope that the Philippines has a quick recovery.

"British Police Arrest Couple on Suspicion of Holding Three Women Captive"



A man and a woman, both sixtyseven, were arrested for allegedly holding three women captive for over thirty years. All three women appear to be extremely traumatized and also appear to have been held in servitude most of their lives. The investigation was launched in October, when the Freedom Charity reported receiving a call from a woman who said she had been held against her will in the house for more than thirty years.

A sixty-nine year old Malaysian, a fifty-seven year old Irish and a thirty year old British woman have been taken to a place of safety, according to the Metropolitan Police. "We applaud the actions of Freedom Charity and are working in partnership to support these victims who appear to have been held for over 30 years", said Detective Inspector Kevin Hyland. "We have launched an extensive investigation to establish the facts surrounding these very serious allegations," he added. Last month, the charity Walk Free Foundation issued the first Global Slavery Index, in which it was revealed that there are more than 4,000 slaves in Britain.
