Current Events

Coronavirus disease 19 is an infectious disease caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome. It was first identified in December, 2019 in Wuhan, Hubei, China and has resulted in an ongoing pandemic.



There have been more cases reported across the globe with more deaths, than recoveries. Common symptoms include fever, cough, fatigue, shortness of breath, difficulties breathing and loss of smell and taste, multi organ failure, septic shock and blood clots. The incubation period may range from two to fourteen days. The disease mainly spreads when people are close in proximity. It spreads very easily and sustainably, mainly whenever breathing, coughing, sneezing, talking and singing. It can spread for up to two days prior to symptom onset. Some symptoms such as difficulty breathing are more common in patients who need hospital care. This symptom appears early in the illness. Some people have a sore throat, and headaches. Some symptoms appear earlier than others and you can also have no symptoms whatsoever and could possibly have the virus. We currently have 25 cases in Adams County right now.

In my opinion, this virus is definitely life changing. We have never really had anything like this happen to us in the world so it's very different and hard to cope with. Many months after being quarantined you can now go out but there are so many rules to doing this. To go anywhere or to even walk inside somewhere you have to have a mask and only have 6 or less people with you. I absolutely hate what this virus has brought the world to. You just feel like you can't do anything or go anywhere without having a mask and doing so much. School has also been really stressful having to wear a mask

and focus with them on. You also have to remain 6 feet from everyone. We can't see everyone because we are all split up between blue and gold groups. Sports are not as fun.
